Port Tenants and Moorage Holders,

Last year a notice was sent out to all Port tenants and moorage holders about Oregon Department of Environmental Quality 1200-Z NPDES Industrial Stormwater general permit.

The Port of Brookings Harbor has recently received the approval from DEQ. The 1200-Z permit requires significant monitoring and stormwater testing starting at once. The Port begins in a Tier 1 category that last for two years. Testing, monitoring and reporting must be done in the first two years. After two years of stormwater testing, if the average benchmarks are exceeded, the Port will be placed into a Tier 2 category. In a Tier 2 category, the Port will be required to make significant changes to its infrastructure and stormwater control to meet stormwater quality standards.

It is imperative that all Port tenants and moorage holders continue following all applicable federal, state and local laws and to use best practices when conducting activities that may have an effect on stormwater quality.

As part of either a Port lease or moorage agreement, Port tenants and moorage holders are required to comply with all government laws and regulations. Government laws and regulations including Port Ordinance No. 1-1998, as amended from time to time. That Ordinance, among other things, regulates Port charges, permissible uses of Port property, procedures for various activities, and addresses liability damages arising out of the use of Port facilities.
